


6th Form Pathways



Students in our sixth form access one of three pathways. All students continue to develop skills and knowledge in core, functional subjects: **English, maths** and **ICT**. The curriculum focuses on Preparation for Adulthood, with students accessing weekly lessons of **My Health, My Independence, My Community** and **My Future**. PE is taught weekly, with a focus on staying active and accessing sports and leisure facilities. Magic Breakfast is organised and delivered by 6th form, offering appropriate work placements to all students.

Regardless of pathway, all 16-19 study programmes offer a broad range of enrichment opportunities and vocational 'tasters' (for further information please see '14-19 Options').

Pathway to Independence




Pre-Entry/
Entry Level 1

Students continue to develop their maths and English skills, with a key focus on functional communication and independence.




Students complete **OCR Life and Living Skills** units in Maths, Communication, ICT and personal and social development. They build upon previous attainment to achieve a Diploma sized qualification.

Pathway to Progression




Entry Level 1/2

Students develop functional skills in maths, English and ICT. Study programmes include opportunities to increase independence and explore the world of work.



Students work towards **Functional Skills** qualifications in Maths and English. They also complete **OCR Life and Living Skills** units in ICT, personal and social development and employability.

Progression Routes:



- FE Specialist College (Supported Learning Courses focusing on Independent Living and/or Employability)
- Volunteering opportunities

Pathway to Work




Entry Level 2/3

Students continue to develop their functional skills in maths, English and ICT. They further develop their independence and employability skills with opportunities such as travel training and work experience placements.



Students work towards **Functional Skills** qualifications in Maths and English. They also complete **OCR Life and Living Skills** units in ICT, personal and social development and employability. Some students may achieve Functional Skills qualifications in Digital Skills.

Progression Routes:



- FE Specialist College (Employability programme or specific vocational course from EL3 upwards)
- Supported Internship
- Volunteering opportunities
